

# Continuity of Education Plan (CEP)

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# **OVERVIEW OF THE CEP**

As we return to studies in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, we do so with the hope that studies can be conducted in a smooth and efficient manner. However, it is imperative that we plan for further disruption, given the dynamic nature of the recent rise in variant case, and the push to achieve community protection through vaccination.

To this end, Northern College presents this Continuity of Education Plan (CEP).

The plan will provide ready access to information regarding Health and Safety protocols in the event of further emergencies, information regarding the continuation of studies if face-to-face study is disrupted, and links to useful resources in the event of an emergency.

## NORTHERN COLLEGE CEP

In the event of a campus emergency closure, such as a COVID-19 outbreak, Northern College will take all appropriate steps to safeguard the well-being of the campus communities, while enacting plans for the continuity of College activities, principally learning and services.

The College CEP examines potential disruptions to studies and services through the framework of a combination of staged restrictions in which the College successfully operated during previous measures, and the newly released Health Measures Framework (HMF) for Fall of 2021.

The Northern College Pandemic CEP is based on the following three steps provided by the Provincial Government:

## IN THE EVENT OF A PROVINCIAL LOCKDOWN:

- Students, Staff, Faculty, and Visitors are encouraged to check the College website (<u>www.northernc.on.ca</u>) for the latest information regarding any disruption to normal activities.
- Subject to further guidance from the Provincial Government and Local Public Health Units, the College will respond to restrictions with full compliance regarding Campus closures, PPE, and capacity limits up to and including the complete elimination of face-to-face delivery of instruction.
- In the event of a complete restriction on face-to-face instruction, the College, under advisement of the Vice President Academic and Student Success and Academic Deans, will enact program specific contingency plans that may result in a shift to online instruction, course and program level reorganizations, and possible changes in the duration and completion dates for current semesters and start dates and durations of future semesters.
- The College will publish on its website and in social media, information regarding plans for Program Delivery Methods for each program at the outset of the semester, and will update those plans based on future restrictions or changes to our permissions to operate provided by Provincial and Local Health agencies.

#### IN THE EVENT OF A LOCALIZED OUTBREAK AT A CAMPUS OR LEARNING CENTRE:

- The campus or learning centre will be closed based on the direction of the local Health Unit
- Individuals will be asked to remain at home and follow direction from the local Health Unit.
- Contact tracing will be conducted by the local Health Unit.
- The outbreak will be declared over by the Health Unit after 14 days have passed with no evidence of ongoing transmission that can reasonably be related to the exposure at the campus or learning centre.
- Once the outbreak has been declared over and proper cleaning protocols completed will the campus or learning centre reopen for staff and students.
