#### **PROGRAM OBJECTIVES**

Northern College in partnership with The Miller Group has developed a training program that covers the knowledge required of a Road Maintenance Worker, provides hands-on- training, and helps trainees gain valuable experience. This program will position the student to gain year-round employment as a Road Maintenance Worker.

By the end of this program, students will be:

- o Qualified skilled patrollers able to identify road defects such as potholes, washouts and other basic deficiencies
- o Able to replace or repair steel guiderails and cable guiderails
- o Experienced in best practices for treating roads before, during and after weather events
- o Trained on how to properly and safely thaw culverts and provide drainage for trouble areas
- o Capable of creating and reading documentation and reports
- o Able to recognize inclement weather patterns and how they impact operations
- o Aware of environmental factors influencing road conditions
- o Knowledgeable in salt and sand management
- o Trained in providing Emergency Response
- o Fully trained on all aspects of the snow plow operation and maintenance
- o Trained as loader, forklift and skid steer operators

#### **CERTIFICATION**

Participants who successfully complete this 12 week program will receive a Northern College Certificate. To obtain this certification, the participant must obtain an overall passing grade of 80%. Students must also maintain at a minimum 98% attendance throughout the program. This standard must be upheld knowing that students missing classes will miss critical instruction.

## **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

In order to enroll in this program, participants must be at least 18 years of age, possess a minimum education level of Grade 10 or equivalent and hold a valid "DZ" license.

Applicants must complete the following:

- ✓ Registration form
- ✓ Mechanical Reasoning Test

Acceptance letters will be issued after completed registration package and copy of DZ license have been provided.

## **FEE SCHEDULE**

Non-refundable tuition fees for this program are \$12,775.00

Included in the program will be:

- 12 week Highway Maintenance Program training
- Personal Protective Equipment \*\*
- Graduation

\*Tuition does not include the cost of accommodations or travel to the training locations

Rates are reviewed annually.

Seats will be given on a first paid basis. Our minimum number of participants per intake is 8.





For those who are not eligible for sponsorship, a non- refundable deposit of \$1,000.00 will be required in order to secure their seats. Tuition must be paid in full prior to commencing training.

Only a letter confirming sponsorship from a sponsoring agency will be accepted in lieu of the deposit. A letter confirming a schedule of financial assistance must be submitted.

If you are thinking of applying for Second Career funding, it is important to remember that this process can take up to 8 weeks before approval is confirmed. Please contact your local service providers to verify funding eligibility and to begin the process of completing the application package.
