- 2. PTE - Pearson Test of English** (Academic)  
Diploma or Certificate programs: 58+  
Post-Graduate Certificate or Diploma programs: 60+
- 3. TOEFL - Test of English as a Foreign Language**  
A score of 550 paper and 213 computer-based; 79-IBT
- Native English speakers or applicants who have/had English as the medium of instruction of all their school education might be considered to waive English proficiency requirements if they meet our requirements. #### Additional Expenses

In addition to your tuition and fees, you can expect the following expenses for a place to live (accommodations), food, and a way to get to classes and to work (transportation) during your time in Canada. The following is an approximate breakdown of the cost of living for a one-year period (12 months) for students studying in Canada living on your own:

Room & Board: Approximately \$750/month (\$9,000)

Transportation (bus/taxi): Approximately \$20/week (\$960)

Miscellaneous: Approximately \$20/week (\$960)

Books & Supplies: Approximately \$1,400

## Project Management

(1 Year, 2 semesters post-graduate certificate program)

The Project Management program is an innovative program providing students with highly marketable skills in overall project management and leadership. Project managers plan, organize, direct, control and evaluate the activities of organizations that analyze, design, develop, implement, operate and administer a variety of projects. They are employed throughout the public and private sectors.

### Occupational Areas

Graduates of this program will learn how to initiate, plan, monitor and control projects through to successful completion. They acquire the competencies to lead diverse project teams within a broad range of sectors in public, private and not-for-profit settings while applying content-specific knowledge of their previous studies and experiences.

The Project Management Institute (PMI) predicts a 33% growth rate for the Project Management (PM) labour force between 2017-2027 across 11 countries, including Canada (Project Management institute, 2017). Within Ontario, the provincial government foresees an above average employment outlook for project managers working within the construction industry between 2017-2021, with job growth predicted to be 10.1-11% in the field (Government of Ontario, n.d.).
