




SAFEASSIGN – HOW TO SET

Setting SafeAssign Settings


1. In Assignment #2, click the down arrow then click **Edit**.



2. Scroll down until you get to the header **Submission Details**, Click on it.




3. Under Plagiarism Tools, you will see “Check submission for plagiarism using SafeAssign”. Check the box next to it, and then also click the next one that says “Allow students to view SafeAssign originality report for their attempts”.




This allows the student to see the same report for their assignment that you will see as the teacher.

4. Under Number of Attempts, select **Multiple**



5. When using SafeAssign, teachers normally will allow students two attempts



The first attempt they can submit and receive their originality report to then have an opportunity to fix their assignment and go back and resubmit it.

6. When you are done, click **Submit**




Assignment #2 now requires students to submit their assignment through SafeAssign.


What the Student Sees When They Submit Their Assignment

For the students, there is no difference when submitting their assignment with the exception of one checkbox.


1. They navigate to the assignment...



2. They click on **Browse My Computer**



3. Choose the assignment they'd like to submit, and click Open



Only difference will be that, under Plagiarism Tools, they can select “I agree to submit my papers to the global reference database”


