





The Need to Indigenize

Exclusion and misrepresentation of Indigenous Peoples

Academic curricula have primarily been developed in ways that privilege the dominant, Euro-Western culture through the content, approaches to teaching and learning, and values about knowledge. The experiences, worldviews, and histories of Indigenous Peoples have been excluded in education systems, because they were seen as less valuable or relevant. Perceptions of Indigenous Peoples were often misrepresentative and perpetuated stereotypes. This exclusion and misrepresentation was one of the most damaging impacts of colonialism and one of



Evolution of Academia and Higher Education



The definition of "student" is expanding as all kinds of learners seek out the skills of tomorrow





By 2030, there will be an estimated **increase of nearly 120 million students** participating in higher education worldwide



Supporting learners of all capabilities requires campus-wide resources like career development and counseling offices to be accessible for all



Student populations are increasingly diverse—25% are single parents, 20% are over age 25, and 50% are financially independent



4-year degrees are being replaced by **lifelong learning** and the "50-year degree" to enable reskilling as careers evolve
