A LONG HISTORY OF SUCCESS IN EDUCATION

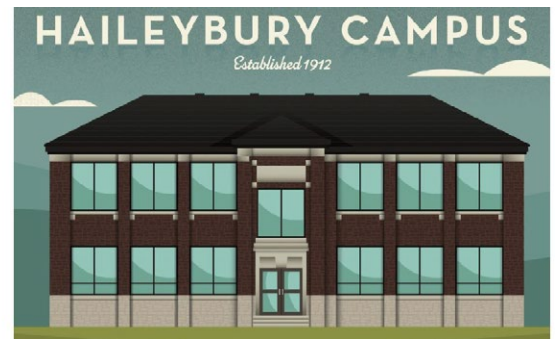
For over one hundred years, Northern College has been a centre for learning and professional development in Ontario's northeast.

The Moose teaches tranquility and the importance of moving forward with calm strength.

The Flowers represent renewal and new beginnings, perfectly mirroring this time of transition.

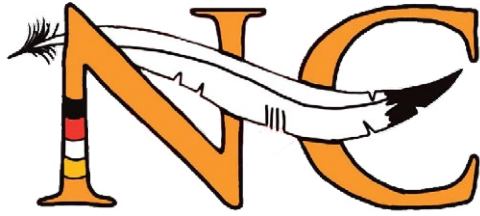
The Bear embodies courage: the courage to speak, to stand tall, and to be the strength others can lean on.

The Eagle Feather represents strength, nobility, courage, perseverance, respect, and wisdom. Traditionally gifted by elders or leaders to mark great achievements, the eagle feather is a sacred symbol. For many Indigenous students, receiving an eagle feather or plume during graduation is as meaningful as receiving the diploma itself.

The Goose represents the traditional Spring Goose Harvest, an important time when many Cree families along the James Bay coast return to the land. It also symbolizes working together, and helping one another to reach a common goal or destination—values deeply reflected in the journey of education and community.

These teachings and symbols are not only sewn into fabric, but into the spirit of Northern College's commitment to reconciliation, inclusion, and community.

We extend heartfelt thanks to artists Justice Sutherland, John Reuben, Wayne McKenzie, and Chance Kweciarz-Luke for sharing their gifts with us. Their contributions transform this year's convocation into something more than a celebration—it becomes a moment of connection, reflection, and shared meaning.



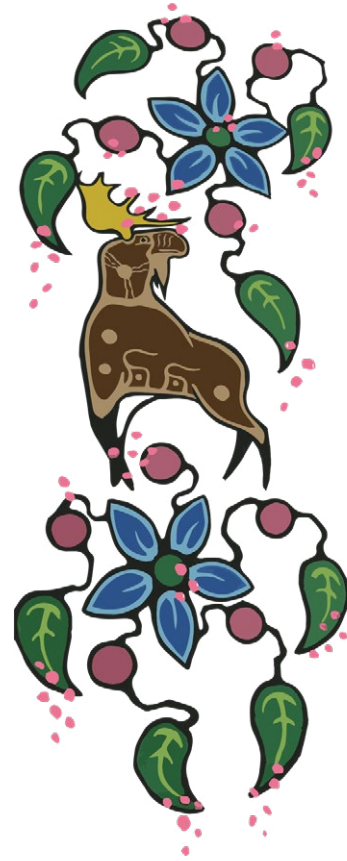
